(Toronto - June28, 2017) Experience Garlic in the 60s, (1860s) at the 7th annual Toronto Garlic Festival. The humble garlic bulb has come a long way in Ontario's history. Indeed garlic's Toronto history can be traced from the gardens outside the mess kitchen at Fort York in the 19th century to the post war slums of The Ward and out of the suitcases of the 1970s immigrant wave to Toronto. This sturdy and determined bulb, garlic, is now the unlikely star of its own annual celebration taking place this year at Artscape Wychwood Barns on Sunday, September 17, 2017.

On the Music Stage, a curated series of artists will perform songs from many of the cultures that spread their appreciation of garlic across Toronto, Ontario and beyond.

Getting back to the future, a 360 Virtual Reality Farm Tour returns this year to immerse visitors in a cathartic garlic harvesting experience and in real life the celebrity of the festival - Ontario garlic - will be available in spades to be purchased directly from Ontario farmers and purveyors, along with garlic jams, jellies, preserves, sauces, spirits and Ontario wine and beer.

Festival founder, author and garlic farmer Peter McClusky proudly proclaimed, "Garlic-laden dishes prepared at this year's festival will include wild garlic bannock, bison and garlic sausage, even a wild garlic and berry ice-cream and are creations that are just not available at other garlic festivals around the world." McClusky continued, "With an increasing number of festival visitors attending from outside the province, we're pleased to offer garlic inspired cuisine and merchandise that reflects the rich diversity of not only garlic, but of those who grow, harvest and produce value-add garlic products in Ontario."

Other festival activities include the infamous Garlic Breath Contest, the popular Raw Garlic Shot Station, Garlic Braiding and Art Workshops, cooking demos, film screenings Symphony of the Soil, Dance Me Outside & The Don Francks & Family Documentary Freedom Family; special

guest appearances by Chef Justin Cournoyer, ecologist Sarah Hargreaves, and food advocate David Cohlmeyer, among others.
